### War Memorial in Chavey Down

We are pleased to report the go ahead for a memorial to be erected in front of St Martin's Church to commemorate the lives of the village boys who gave their lives in WW1. Thank you everyone who contacted us to lend their support to this initiative. If there are any budding artists in the village who wish to design a simple memorial, Ruth Timbrell would love to receive your designs.

### **Dustbins and Recycling Bins**

It has been reported to us that some wheelie bins are being left out on the pavement on a permanent basis. Not only is this a potential hazard, but it also unsightly. This is particularly prevalent at the top of North Road, Cannon Mews and into Priory Road. Please can we respectfully ask you to abide by Bracknell Forest Council's edict which is to ensure the correct container is out at the kerbside for collection by 6.30 am on the day of collection. This can be done the night before but once emptied must be returned to your property.

### Traffic Lights at the Royal Foresters Junction

There have been a number of incidents reported of near misses occurring at the junction of the Royal Foresters with traffic from Bracknell turning right into Swinley Road (across the lane of the traffic coming from Swinley Road, whose traffic lights are green for them to proceed). It has been reported to Bracknell Forest Council by two of our committee members but we have been told that unfortunately there is nothing they can do to prevent red light jumpers. It was suggested that a filter light might work but we have been advised that this is not feasible at this junction. If you witness any incidents of this nature, please contact Rob Brown at the Highways Department of Bracknell Forest Council on 01344 352000 and report these incidents every time they happen. It doesn't matter if you haven't got the details of the cars jumping the lights, they just need a guick summary of what happened and date and time. Let's try to prevent there being a fatal accident at this junction and encourage Bracknell Council to find a solution.

#### North Road Plug Jumpers (from Cannon Mews!)

Plug jumpers coming from Cannon Mews have been spotted repeatedly abusing the plugs. If residents of the village do this, so will others and the whole point of them will be lost. So *please* obey the law and help maintain peaceful roads in our village. Number plate details may be taken in the future and reported to the Police.

### Planning

CALA – Land at Palm Hills, Dolyhr and adjacent to Sandbanks, Long Hill Road. Whilst there is no formal planning application validated for this site as yet, one is expected. As part of the Core Strategy, recently approved by a planning inspector for the Borough's Long-term Housing plans, this site was considered acceptable to accommodate 71 homes. This is what the anticipated planning application will ask for. Member of the CDA email scheme were alerted to a public exhibition on proposed plans and several attended. #### Warfield Park Expansion Plans

At the same time Warfield Park have been talking to local people about their expansion plans. Most recent indicators are that they will ask for permission for a further 146 mobile homes, mostly situated on the fields of Chavey Down Farm. Residents are advised that this land is classed as countryside and was not approved as part of the Core Strategy. The Chavey Down Association will be vigorously opposing plans.
