#### Traffic Lights at the Royal Foresters Junction

#### Planning

**14/00528/ful – Lapland UK** - This is a Section 73 application for the variation of condition 2 (time operation) of planning permission 13/00428/T. It seeks to remove the restriction of Tour Times: Monday - Friday between 13:00hrs and 15:30hrs, a restriction which was imposed as part of condition 02 by BFBC to ensure local traffic was not adversely affected. Pending decision.

14/00569/ful – CALA Homes – Land at Palm Hills, Dolyhir (London Road) and adjacent to Sandbanks, Long Hill Road. Erection of 62 dwellings comprising 5no. 1 bedroom flats, 10no. 2 bedroom flats, 29no. 4 bedroom houses and 18 no. 5 bedroom houses, including the demolition of two existing residential dwellings (C3 use) and two building associated with guest house/hotel (C1 use), landscaping. vehicular access from London Road, parking, open space and pedestrian/cycle link to Long Hill Road. Pending decision.

**14/00433/ful – Warfield Park.** The erection of an additional 142 mobiles. Withdrawn.

**13/01023/OUT** – Land Adjacent to Wimbrel, Long Hill Road. Outline application for the erection of 1 house outside settlement area. Appeal currently on hold.

**14/00572/ful – The Conifers, Chavey Down Road.** Erection of 2 no. detached 4 bed dwellings with integral garages within the grounds, including new accesses from Woolford Close. Pending decision.

**14/00137/trtpo** - 3 The Pines Long Hill Road (now Sandby House) Application to fell 24 trees. Withdrawn.

**14/00167/TRTPO** - Foxbury 104 Locks Ride Ascot. Application to Fell 1 tree and prune 1 tree. Pending decision.

**14/00160/TRTPO** - 86 Locks Ride. Application to Fell 1 tree and prune 1 tree. Withdrawn.

**14/00159/TRTPO** – Also 86 Locks Ride. Application to fell an area of Laurel. Withdrawn.

**14/00208/ful – Meadow View and Eden Vale Chavey Down Road**. Erection of two-storey rear extensions to both Meadow View and Eden Vale and a single storey side extension to Meadow View following demolition of existing single and two storey extensions. The erection of 2 x 5 bedroom detached dwellings with garage to the rear of Meadow View and Eden Vale, car parking, access and landscaping to Meadow View and Eden Vale. Refused. **13/01018/T** – Land Between Merrymead and Pine Acres Birch Lane Ascot Berkshire. Change of use of land for use as a residential caravan site for 1 no. gypsy pitch, with retention of a total of 2 no. caravans, 1 no. portable amenity building, stable block and hard standing for a period of five years. Refused.

**Update on trees at Pump Rough (Locks Ride/Sandy Lane)** – A letter has been sent from Bracknell Forest Council to SE Water giving them 6 months to conform to the requirements of the replanting order or enforcement action will commence. Their deadline ends  $19^{th}$  November 2014.

### Trial of New Westerly Departure Routes from Heathrow

A trial of new Westerly Departure Routes from Heathrow starts on 25<sup>th</sup> August and finishes on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2015. We understand that the aim of these trials is to reduce the intervals between take-offs by using more departure routes and using routes which diverge more significantly from each other than the currently approved routes. Heathrow would then be able to have more departures while still meeting the legally stipulated safety criteria for separation between aircraft.

There are six new routes, four of which will track over **Ascot**, **Sunningdale**, **Sunninghill and Bracknell** compared with one which currently tracks to the east of Sunningdale. One of the new routes tracks south west over Cheapside, another tracks west of the racecourse at which point it turns south, and the third tracks south west over Sunningdale to Lightwater before turning south. The fourth route tracks south west over Bracknell town centre. By the time aircraft are in our area they will be at 3,000 feet or higher. There is no information about the frequency of departures on these routes.

According to Ascot News (20/08/14) a Heathrow spokeswoman said "It is all part of the airspace modernisation strategy which has not been upgraded for 40 years". The same paper quotes a NATS Holdings spokeswoman as saying "Basically it is upgrading technology and streamlining old designs".

It is hard to believe that anything has remained unchanged for 40 years, where air travel is concerned!!!

The problem of aircraft queuing for take-off is certainly many years old, so why only instigate this test now?

The test period, in the quieter months of the year may be the best period from the point of view of causing least disruption on account of any teething problems, but it will not give a true indication of noise nuisance for the busy summer period.

At present, it is understood that the burden of noise is shared around the affected areas, by changing flight paths during each day or every few days. If more flight paths are to be used routinely, the scope for such sharing will be curtailed.

If a third runway were to be built at Heathrow, the extra flight paths which are the subject of the proposed test would be needed permanently since, although an extra runway would allow more aircraft to take-off, with less delays on the ground, once in the air they have to be distributed. There would be more flights and a more dense use of all flight paths.

Finally, it should be noted that in the next few months or in a year or two a decision will be made regarding the siting of any new airport capacity in the UK.

The proposed test of more flight paths could be taking place at this time as part of Heathrow's attempt to persuade the government that it should be chosen for that capacity.

Aircraft noise is relevant to the protection of our environment. There are specialist groups who concentrate on aviation matters so we suggest that any members or residents who wish to comment should contact specialist and accountable bodies such as:
